

The NCSA-AST Legislative Committee has been working diligently on moving our legislative efforts forward. We have been pursuing opportunities with AORN's pending legislation efforts, Senate Bill SB371, "Patient Safety in Operating Rooms". The committee has also been networking with Senator Fletcher L. Hartsell, Jr., District 36 for Cabarrus and Union counties, in an effort to get the profession, certification, and advancement of Surgical Technologists out in the community.

On Friday, September 26, an executive meeting was hosted by NCSA to educate executives in our community about Surgical Technology, as well as, the importance of certification for patient advocacy. The discussion included credentialing, professional competencies, the importance of ongoing professional development, and risk management from the Surgical Technologist's perspective. Roy Zacharias, CST, FAST, AST President, represented AST and the legislative efforts at this meeting.

### **SHARING the IMPORTANCE of EDUCATION**

A goal for NCSA-AST Board Members is to provide continuing education throughout the state. Once a Surgical Technologist receives their certification, they are required to maintain the credential with 60 continuing education credits every 4 years. The NCSA-AST board offered 3 workshops in 2014. One was in Nags Head, a second in Asheville, and the state meeting was held in Concord, North Carolina. 2015 Continuing Education will kick-off with North Carolina holding their 1st NCSA 2 Day Convention. The convention will be a two day event that will include the state business meeting. The dates are March 21-22, 2015 and a total of 12 continuing education credits will be offered.

Education is important on several levels when relating to the healthcare professional. It is important to have a standard level of education to be eligible to take state or national exams after graduating a program. These standards are to ensure the essential knowledge and skills are instilled before starting a career in healthcare. After graduating, one should strive to grow as a professional through educational opportunities to provide optimal surgical patient care.
